Labor in Pennsylvania is depending on Governor Wolf to veto "Right-to-work" (RTW) legislation that may make it to his desk. Thankfully we have Governor Wolf protecting our backs by standing with us on this critical issue. Likewise, we <u>must</u> stand with him. However, don't fool yourself.
