The PA Municipal Election on November 4, 2025 Isn't About the Border. It's Not About Washington.

This election isn't about the border. It's not about Washington. It's about Harrisburg, our schools, our union contracts, and our voting rights. The PA Supreme Court decides what happens in our communities—not on cable news.

While national politicians argue about immigration and foreign policy, our state court decides whether your vote counts, your union contract holds, and your school gets funded.

Don't let national noise drown out local justice. Retaining our PA Conference of Teamsters endorsed Justices Donohue, Dougherty, and Wecht keeps our court focused on fairness—not fringe agendas.

The PA SUPREME COURT AND “RIGHT-TO-WORK”

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court may not write legislation, but it can absolutely shape the legal terrain that determines whether right-to-work laws gain traction or get stopped cold.

Pennsylvania's constitution includes **strong protections for organized labor**, including the right to bargain collectively. If the legislature passes a right-to-work law, the court could rule it **unconstitutional** under state provisions—especially if it undermines union security agreements or impairs contract obligations.

The court can scrutinize whether right-to-work laws serve a legitimate public interest or are simply designed to **weaken unions**. The court has upheld rulings that protect **public sector unions**, including decisions on dues collection and bargaining rights.
